Smoke Alarms

Monthly Requirement to Test Smoke Alarms

Smoke Alarms are required to be tested monthly. Track date of testing below.

Annual Requirement to Replace Smoke Alarm Batteries

- Batteries are required to be replaced annually (or when alarm chirps, warning batteries are nearing the end of their life) unless the smoke alarm uses long-life batteries
- Long-life smoke alarms with batteries sealed inside shall be replaced immediately when alarm chirps warning batteries are nearing end of life

10-Year Requirement to Replace Smoke Alarms

Smoke alarms are required to be replaced within 10 years of the date of manufacture.

- The date is located on the back of the alarm. If there is no date, the smoke alarm is over 10 years old
- Smoke alarms must also be replaced when they fail to operate
- They must be replaced with the same type of power supply (this does not prevent replacing battery powered alarms) with electrically powered alarms with battery backup
- **Tip**: Write the date of scheduled replacement on the outside of the alarm

Carbon Monoxide Detectors

Carbon monoxide detectors are required to be tested monthly. Track date of testing below.

Replacement of Carbon Monoxide Detectors and Batteries

- Carbon monoxide detectors must be replaced every 5 to 7 years, according to manufacturer's instructions.
- Carbon monoxide detector batteries must be replaced according to manufacturer's instructions.
- Carbon monoxide detectors / batteries must also be replaced when they fail to operate.
- **Tip**: Write the date of scheduled replacement on the outside of the detector.

Required Location of Carbon Monoxide Detectors

- Carbon monoxide detectors are required to be located within 10 feet of all sleeping areas.
- Carbon monoxide detectors must be installed according to manufacturer's instructions.
- It is important that they not be placed in 'dead' air pockets such as corners of rooms, at the junction of walls and ceilings, or within thirty-six inches of ventilation ducts.

What to Do if a Carbon Monoxide Detector's Alarm Sounds

- Treat all alarms as real emergencies.
- Evacuate everyone from your home immediately, leaving the door open for ventilation.
- Call 911 once outside.
- Have your home inspected by professionals and carbon monoxide leak repaired prior to resuming care.
- Be sure to clear snow and debris from furnace, dryer, fireplace, and oven vents to prevent carbon monoxide buildup.
