

PRE-LICENSE TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

Applicant required trainings

The following trainings must be taken prior to a license being issued. Create an account at: www.developtoolmn.org.
Upon completion, provide licensor a copy of your learning record created on Develop and a copy of CPR/1st Aid certificates.

Pre-license trainings must be taken within one year of a family child care license being issued. CPR/1st Aid certification must be current prior to licensure.

- o Taken a 3-hour early childhood child development college course in the last 5 years. Verification of completed/passed course must be provided.
- o Received a baccalaureate or master's degree in early childhood education or school-age child care within the past five years. Verification of completed degree must be provided.
- Licensed in Minnesota as a prekindergarten teacher, an early childhood educator, a kindergarten to grade 6 teacher with a prekindergarten specialty, an early childhood special education teacher, or an elementary teacher with a kindergarten endorsement. Verification of teaching license must be provided.
- o Received a baccalaureate degree with a Montessori certificate within the past five years. Verification of completed degree must be provided.
