

## Pool Guidelines and Required Annual Notification of Use to Agency

## Wading pool use:

- A wading pool is any pool that has a maximum depth of 24" or less and can be manually emptied and moved.
- Wading pools must be inaccessible to children except for periods of supervised use.
- Wading pools must be kept clean.
- Parents/guardians must give written permission prior to child use. DCYF has a required form for this.
- Parents/guardians must be given written information regarding the risks of disease transmission and health risks of wading pools. DCYF has a required form for this.
- Prior to use of wading pools, you must review DCYF wading pool best practices.

## Hot tub present at licensed program:

• If water is present in the hot tub, it's highly recommended to have the hot tub covered with a hard cover and locked at all times during operating hours.

## Swimming pool present, child care children do not use:

- Entrance to pool must be made inaccessible to children.
- The ladder must be inaccessible to children during operating hours.
- If the pool is above ground a barrier with a lock around the pool is highly recommended. The county may require a barrier depending on the height of the pool.
- If the pool is underground, a barrier is required.

Swimming	g pool present, child care children <u>do</u> use (initials indicate compliance):
	Swimming pool use is supervised by an approved caregiver at <u>all</u> times.
	Swimming pool must be inaccessible to children except for periods of supervised use.
	The license holder has NOT had a temporary immediate suspension, license revocation, fine, or license suspension in 24 months prior to child care use.
	The license holder has NOT had a correction order or conditional license relating to supervision or health and safety of children in 24 months prior to child care use.
	The license holder notifies the licensing agency <u>every year</u> <b>PRIOR</b> to child care use. Failing to notify the agency on an annual basis may be grounds for a licensing action or correction order.
	<u>Every year</u> the parent/guardian gives written consent allowing their child to use the pool. Parents/guardians must be given information on the risks of swimming pools. DCYF has required forms for use. Failing to obtain annual written parent/guardian permission may be grounds for a licensing action or correction order.
	The license holder has completed a swimming pool operator training course within five years prior to child care pool use, and then at least every five years after.
	The caregiver supervising pool use is trained in CPR and first aid.
	All potty-trained children are toileted before entering the pool.
	All non-notty trained children wear a cwim dianer while in the neel

There are w	ritten safety rules and pool policies which are enforced.	
During child	d care use, a safety rope is kept in place dividing the shallow and deep ends of the pool.	
Local ordina	ances are followed regarding pools, decks, and fencing.	
During child	d care use, the pool water is maintained between 70° and 104°F.	
A Coast Gua	ard approved life ring with attached rope, an exit ladder, and a shepherd's hook are available at all	
Non-compli being restri	ance with pool use guidelines may result in licensing actions or correction orders and the pool use cted.	
Required annual n	otification for swimming pool use:	
Annual date of pool use licensor notification:	Notification allows for pool use for 1 year from this date.  Notification must be renewed every year for continued use.
